

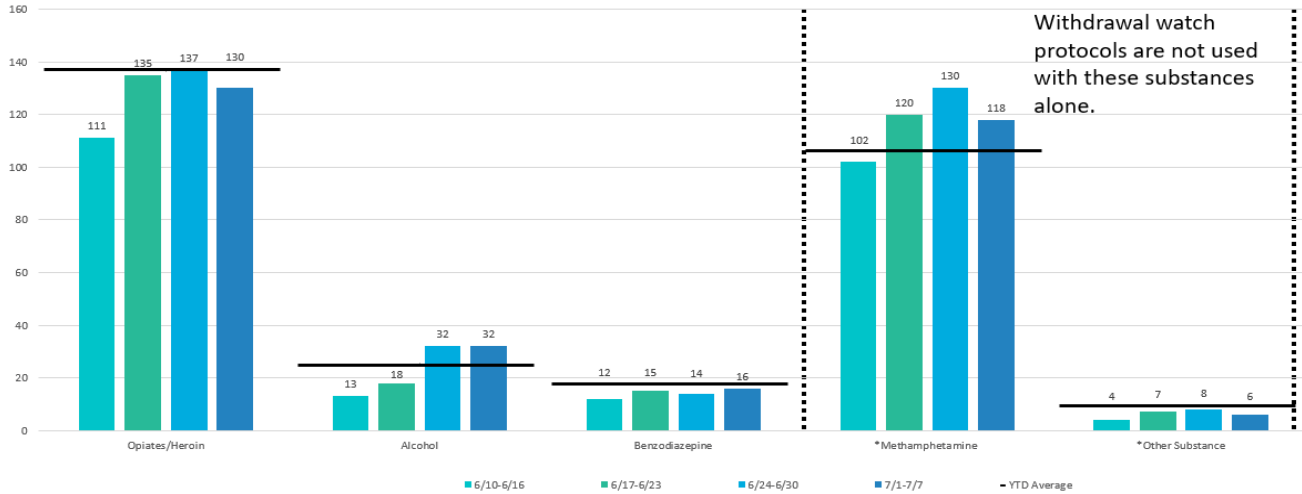

Grant allocation by SHD to Opioid MAC Group expected September/October. Fire Service has trained 800 Snohomish County residents the in consolidated CPR/AED, antidote deployment, and tourniquet application course. The <i>Snohomish County Overdose Awareness Guide</i> is complete and is pending release at September 1 AquaSox game. The Executive Office will be meeting with Mayors and Tribal Leaders on the MAC Group progress and determine future partnership interests.

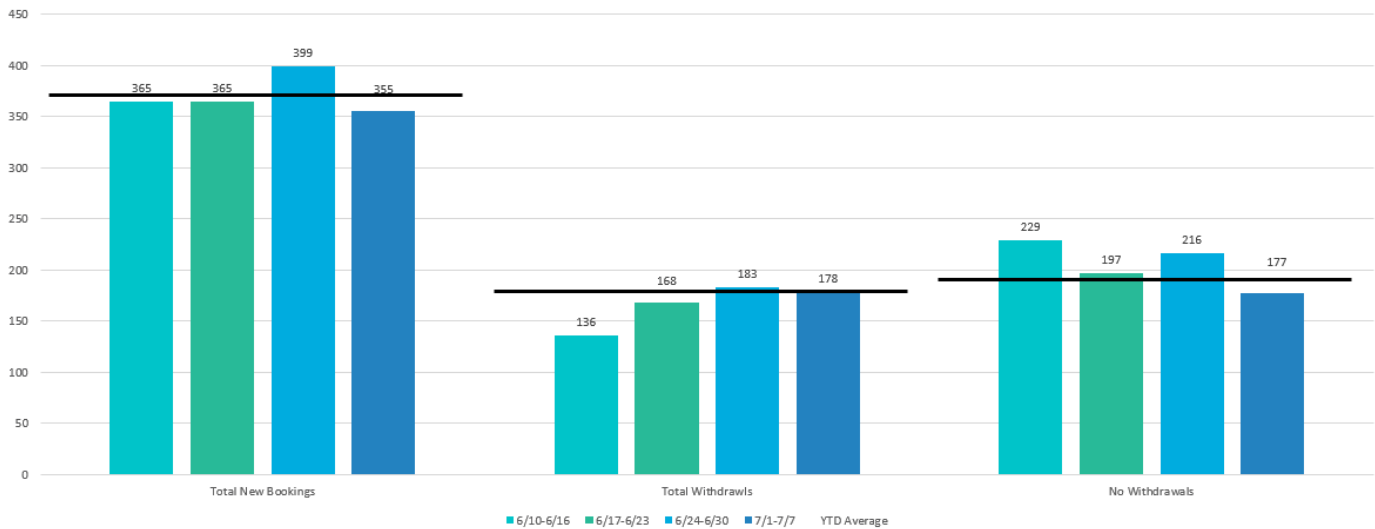
Essential Elements of Information (EEI)

ESF 13 – Detox Withdrawal Watches Initiated by Substance (Previous 4 weeks)



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- ❖ “New Bookings” represent the total (detox and non-detox) daily bookings for the SCSO jail.
- “Methamphetamine” and “Other Substances” are reported in addition to other drugs where withdrawal watch protocols are initiated. Withdrawal watch protocols are not used with these substances alone. With that in mind, every reported “Methamphetamine” and “Other Substances” are in addition to one of the withdrawal watch substances (opioid, alcohol, and/or benzodiazepines). Those inmates laced on withdrawal protocol required enhanced custody supervision, medical care, and special housing for a period of at least 72 hours.
