What is Kratom?

- Kratom (Mitragyna speciosa) is a tropical tree native to Southeast Asia, primarily Malaysia and Thailand
- Leaves can be brewed as tea, chewed or used in capsules
- Active chemicals bind to same receptors as an opioids








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Why is There a Concern?

- Considered a food supplement, it's not regulated
- Nationwide salmonella outbreak linked to kratom; one in Snohomish County
- FDA and DEA have raised concerns & issued warnings about kratom
- Four deaths in 2018 in Snohomish County with kratom in their system



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Is it in Snohomish County?

- Available online and through smoke and vape shops
- 56% of smoke and vape stores surveyed (n= 25) sold kratom
- Most have done so at the request of their customers





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What is Being Done Around the U.S.? Kratom Legality Map Green: Kratom is legal and no restrictions Yellow Legislation in yellow states have been amended Corange: There is pending legislation on Kratom in these states Blue: States with failed legislation and remains legal. Red. banned states schedule I for kratom Purple: Study involving kratom Red Dot banned city for kratom Light Green: Natural Form ONLY

Proposed Resolution

Calls on the Washington State legislature to take meaningful action to address kratom that could include:

- Enacting a ban on kratom and/or its active compounds mitragynine and 7-hydroxymitragynine
- Placing age restrictions
- Requiring additional research and data collection
- Providing for an educational campaign
